"The Mission" is a 1986 motion picture nominated for seven academy awards including best picture staring Robert De Niro and Jeremy Irons based on a true story set in 18th century colonial Brazil and the Amazonian rainforest. The film tells the story of two very different men, Father Gabriel (Irons), a Jesuit missionary who seeks to establish a mission base in the Argentine jungle to convert, educate, and protect the indigenous people. Mercenary and slaver Rodrigo Mendoza (De Niro) who is at first at odds with Gabriel, but after he kills his own brother begins a journey of redemption and purpose that brings him into the Jesuit order at the Mission. Trouble comes to this idillic bastion when a cardinal is called by the colonial authorities to decide if the Mission should continue or if it should be closed and the people left behind enslaved. How these two priests react to the crisis of the Mission delves deeply into the power of love or if might really does makes right.
