#### The Celebrant continues

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

## The Blessing



The Church of the Multiplication is a modern chapel opened in 1982 that replaces a fourth century church that was destroyed by fire in 685 and abandoned. The modern chapel retains the ancient mosaic of the five loaves and two fishes of the Gospel account along with the stone under the altar mensa, reputed to be the spot where Jesus sat to preach and perform the miracle that day.
