



Announcements



The cross of Saint Andrew, patron saint of Scotland and The Dune Church, is also called a Saltire. It is believed that the apostle Andrew was crucified on a saltire (an X-shaped) cross; hence the name St. Andrew's Cross.

He is said to have told his executioners that he was not worthy to be crucified on the same sort of cross as Jesus, and persuaded them to alter the shape.

Answer. **It is meet and right so to do.**



The Prayer of Consecration

Priest. ALL glory be to thee, Almighty God, our heavenly Father, for that thou, of thy tender mercy, didst give thine only Son Jesus Christ to suffer death upon the Cross for our redemption; who made there by his one oblation of himself once offered a full, perfect, and sufficient sacrifice, oblation, and satisfaction, for the sins of the whole world; and did institute, and in his holy Gospel command us to continue, a perpetual memory of that his precious death and sacrifice, until his coming again:

For in the night in which he was be- trayed he took Bread; and when he had given thanks, he brake it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, Take, eat, this is my Body, which is given for you; Do this in remembrance of me.

AND we most humbly beseech thee, O merciful Father, to hear us; and, of thy almighty goodness, vouchsafe to bless and sanctify, with thy Word and Holy Spirit, these thy gifts and creatures of bread and wine; that we, receiving them according to thy Son our Saviour Jesus Christ's holy institution, in remembrance of his death and passion, may be partakers of his most blessed Body and Blood.



Our preacher this week is the Right Reverend Peter Eaton, Episcopal Bishop of Southeast Florida. He read Classics at King's College, London; Theology at Queens' College, Cambridge; and was trained for the priesthood at Westcott House, Cambridge. He has twice been a Fellow-in-Residence at the School of Theology, Sewanee, and pursued graduate research in early Christian history and literature at Magdalen College, Oxford.

Bishop Eaton was Assistant Curate at All Saints, Maidstone, Kent, the Fellows' Chaplain of Magdalen College, Oxford, the Associate Rector of Saint Paul's, Salt Lake City, Canon Theologian to the Bishop of Utah, Rector of Saint James, Lancaster, Pennsylvania, and the Dean of Saint John's Cathedral in Denver. He was also an adjunct professor at Iliff School of Theology, teaching Anglican theology and liturgy.

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Our preacher for next week will be The Rev. Rutger-Jan (R-J) Heijmen, Rector of Holy Trinity Episcopal Church in West Palm Beach, Florida. R-J received a BA in Art History from The University of California at Berkley and his M. Div. from the Trinity Episcopal School for Ministry in Ambridge, PA. Before his institution as Rector of Holy Trinity in January of 2020, he was the Senior Associate Rector for Education, Stewardship & Student Ministries at St Martin's Episcopal Church in Houston, TX. Prior to seminary he was the New York City Area Director of the Fellowship of Christians in Universities & Schools, Inc. (FOCUS) and was the Director of Young Adult Ministries at Walnut Creek Presbyterian Church in Walnut Creek, California.
