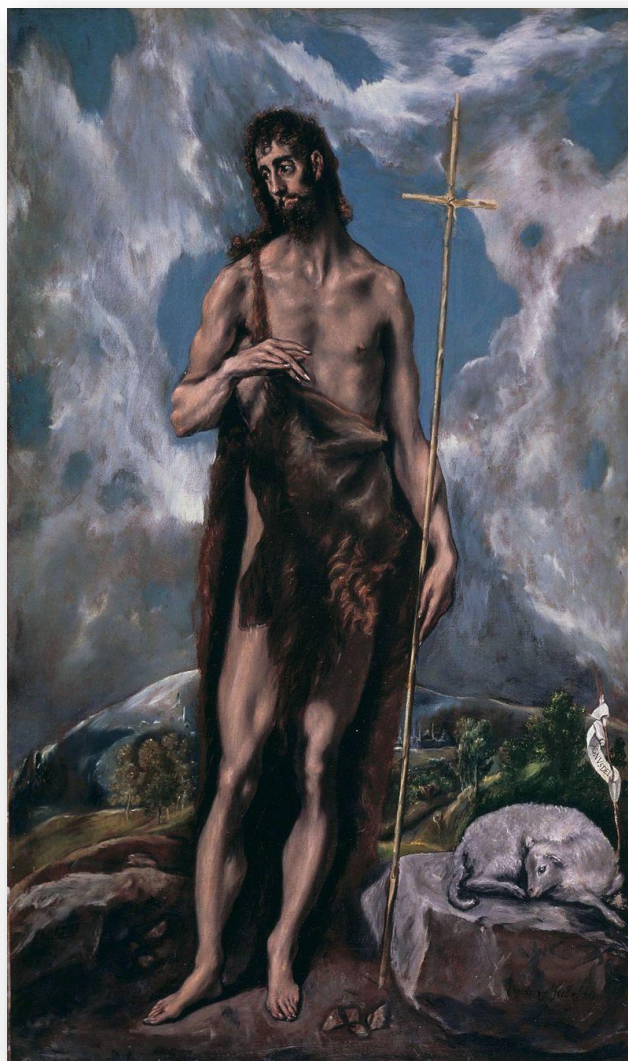

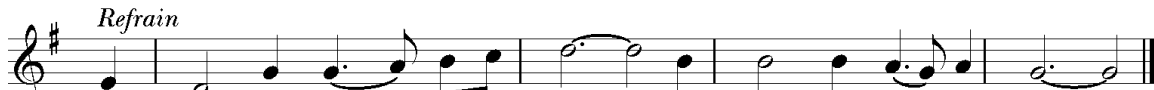

## The Gospel

*Luke 3:1-6*

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Emperor Tiberius, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was ruler of Galilee, and his brother Philip ruler of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias ruler of Abilene, during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the wilderness. 

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.



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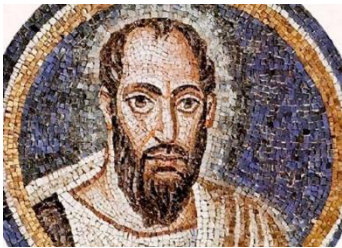

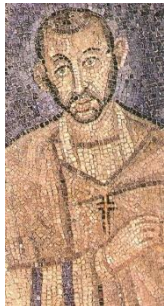

The personal and collective intercessions we make asking our Lord to intercede in our lives and on behalf of others are a central aspect of our private and common worship. At St. John's we have always made an aural reading of our prayer list a part of our regular services. However, there comes with this an important responsibility to maintain it as current and accurate. To accomplish this we are asking our community to take that personal responsibility to heart in the following way:

We ask everyone to please let us know when someone should be added, removed, or otherwise amended on our prayer list. This is accomplished best by either dropping a note in the collection plate or by emailing or calling the parish secretary at (631) 283-0549 or at [secretary@stjohnsouthampton.org](mailto:secretary@stjohnsouthampton.org).

To avoid a name being orphaned on the prayer list names will be removed after 60 days of being added, unless the parish secretary is contacted to extend that time for another 60 days.

Of course, there is no limit to the number of persons we will faithfully include on our prayer list, nor a limit to the duration we will intercede on their behalf. This policy is to take special care in maintaining the names we bring before the Throne of Grace in prayer each time we gather together.

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In the Gospels, Christ, hearing of the imprisonment of Saint John the Baptist, honors him. “Verily I say unto you, Among them that are born of women there hath not risen a greater than John the Baptist.” Yet, in the Gospel according to Saint John, when learning that Christ is rising in the esteem and excitement of the people eclipsing him, John the Baptist says, “Ye yourselves bear me witness, that I said, I am not the Christ, but that I am sent before him. He that hath the bride is the bridegroom: but the friend of the bridegroom, which standeth and heareth him, rejoiceth greatly because of the bridegroom's voice: this my joy therefore is fulfilled. He must increase, but I must decrease.” John is prominently mentioned in the contemporary history of the Jews. The Antiquities of the Jews by Flavius Josephus barely mentions Christ, but John was described as a prophet whose message was universally accepted and his virtue made his martyrdom a cause of God’s judgement against Herod. It is the prophetic identity and ministry of John the Baptist that fit the expectations of people and historians in the world he knew, and this made his impact more significant for his peers. But in the centuries since then he has diminished just as Christ has increased. What has changed? As Christ said immediately after praising him above, “the one who is least in the kingdom of God is greater than he.” Surely John is a member of the Kingdom of God, but what He means here is that the life of the Christian is greater than the life of even the greatest of Israel’s prophets. Prophets are called to be the mouthpieces of God, empowered by the Holy Spirit for a moment in time to speak God’s words and judgement. They fulfill a role, and then disappear. But, the Christian is empowered by the Holy Spirit for not merely a role or moment, but to be changed. We are redeemed by Christ’s sacrifice, we are promised eternal life by His resurrection, but through the agency of the Holy Spirit we become new people, perfected into the image and ministry of Christ, and adopted as children of God and inheritors into His kingdom. When Christ descended to the Dead, among those whom He brought into paradise was John the Baptist. John, like the Blessed Virgin Mary, needed Christ’s redemption and resurrection to enter into the Kingdom of God. John could only prophesy in his earthly ministry to Christ, but with us now he can join Christ in His eternal priesthood and share in the kingdom of God. There could be no greater man born of woman, but, we and John, born by water and the Spirit, aspire to so much more
