Invitation for Confession

Get to Know Dr. Robert Scott Norris

Dr. Robert Scott Norris serves as the Senior Pastor of the Royal Poinciana Chapel in Palm Beach, Florida, a role he has held for more than 22 years. A pastor since 1979, he brings over four decades of ministry shaped by theological depth, pastoral warmth, and a commitment to worship that is both reverent and creatively alive.

Dr. Norris is a graduate of Princeton Theological Seminary, where he earned the Master of Divinity (M.Div.), Master of Theology (Th.M.), and Doctor of Ministry (D.Min.) degrees. He later returned to Princeton Seminary as Adjunct Faculty, contributing to the formation of future pastors and leaders.

Before coming to Palm Beach, Dr. Norris served several influential Presbyterian congregations, including Westminster Presbyterian Church in Upper St. Clair, Pennsylvania, and Memorial Drive Presbyterian Church in Houston, Texas. His earlier ministry included pastorates at First Presbyterian Church of Allentown, PA (his first call), The Presbyterian Church in Liberty Corner, NJ, and Westminster Presbyterian Church in Berkeley Heights, NJ. His spiritual roots trace back to his home congregation, First Presbyterian Church of Bethlehem, PA, where his call to ministry first took shape.

In addition to his congregational leadership, Dr. Norris has been active in the wider community. He serves on the Advisory Board and Instructor of Practical Theology in the School of Ministry at Palm Beach Atlantic University, and has held board and officer roles with two significant Palm Beach County organizations: The Lord's Place and Urban Youth Impact. His service reflects a long-standing commitment to compassion, justice, and the flourishing of vulnerable communities.

At the Royal Poinciana Chapel, Dr. Norris is known for his lyrical liturgical voice, his love for music in worship, and his ability to blend tradition with creative expression. His ministry is marked by pastoral sensitivity, thoughtful preaching, ardent prayers and a steady devotion to guiding people toward hope, beauty, and spiritual depth.
