Invitation for Confession

DEARLY beloved brethren, the Scripture moveth us, in sundry places, to acknowledge and confess our manifold sins and wickedness; and that we should not dissemble nor cloak them before the face of Almighty God our heavenly Father; but confess them with an humble, lowly, penitent, and obedient heart; to the end that we may obtain forgiveness of the same, by his infinite goodness and mercy. And although we ought, at all times, humbly to acknowledge our sins before God; yet ought we chiefly so to do, when we assemble and meet together to render thanks for the great benefits that we have received at his hands, to set forth his most worthy praise, to hear his most holy Word, and to ask those things which are requisite and necessary, as well for the body as the soul. Wherefore I pray and beseech you, as many as are here present, to accompany me with a pure heart, and humble voice, unto the throne of the heavenly grace, and make your humble confession unto Almighty God, devoutly kneeling.

And grant, O most merciful Father, for his sake; That we may hereafter live a godly, righteous, and sober life, To the glory of thy holy Name. Amen.

ALMIGHTY God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who desireth not the death of a sinner, but rather that he may turn from his wickedness and live, hath given power, and commandment, to his Ministers, to declare and pronounce to his people, being penitent, the Absolution and Remission of their sins. 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Get to Know The Right Reverend Peter Eaton

The Right Reverend Peter Eaton is the fourth Bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of Southeast Florida, a multicultural region encompassing over 70 congregations and approximately 25,000 members. Consecrated in 2015 and officially taking office in January 2016, he leads his diverse diocese from Trinity Episcopal Cathedral in Miami, frequently conducting liturgies in English, Spanish, and Haitian Creole. Prior to his current episcopacy, he served as the Dean of Saint John’s Cathedral in Denver, Colorado, bringing a rich, international perspective shaped by an upbringing in the Caribbean and the United Kingdom, alongside degrees from King's College London and Cambridge. Today, Bishop Eaton remains deeply involved in educational governance at regional institutions and connects with the broader community through his podcast, Conversations with Bishop Peter Eaton, where he explores the intersections of modern faith and mental health.

A Lesson from the First letter by Saint Paul to the Corinthians.
